

HOW TO TELL IF YOU ARE READY TO PUBLISH YOUR FICTION BOOK?

- 1. Does your story follow the five elements of plot (exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, resolution)?
- 2. Are all the conflicts resolved? (Even if the book is part of a series, the primary conflict must still be resolved.)
- 3. Check the names of each character. Are they spelled consistently?
- 4. Are your chapter lengths approximately the same length?
- 5. Has an unbiased person read your manuscript?
- 6. Have you edited your manuscript to the best of your ability? (Using grammarly.com is a good start.)
- 7. Have you performed a competitive analysis to determine the best price for your book?
- 8. Have you mapped out the timeline of your book? Does it make sense?
- 9. Do your settings and plot reflect the correct season? (i.e., If it's winter, do you show your character putting a coat on or warming the car.)
- 10. Do you have a marketing plan?

HOW TO TELL IF YOU ARE READY TO PUBLISH YOUR NONFICTION BOOK?

- 1. Have you written everything you attended to share?
- 2. Have you checked all of your facts?
- 3. Have you included footnotes?
- 4. Have you run your manuscript through a plagiarism check?
- 5. Has an unbiased person read your manuscript?
- 6. Have you checked for redundant content? (Sharing the same topic more than once?)
- 7. Have you performed a competitive analysis to determine the best price for your book?
- 8. Do you have a list of all materials you referenced?
- 9. If using Bible scriptures, did you include the book, chapter, verse, and bible version for each occurrence?
- 10. Are you withholding content or not sharing vital information for fear of backlash?
- 11. If you use real people in your book, do you have permission to use their names and likeness?
- 12. Do you have a marketing plan?
